We hope you had a great Christmas and we would like to wish you all a Happy New Year. Rabbits have another exciting half term ahead. Our topic is **Explorers** and we will be exploring The Arctic and travelling back in time to learn about Dinosaurs. In our classroom we have an Arctic themed role-play area and will enjoy pretending to be an Inuit, imagining what it would be like to live in the Arctic. In **Literacy** we will be reading a range of fiction and non-fiction books about The Arctic and Dinosaurs. We will focus on the books 'Penguin Small' and 'Don't wake the Bear, Hare!', 'Harry and the Bucket of Dinosaurs', 'Dinosaurs and all that Rubbish' and 'Ug Boy Genius of the Stone Age'. In Maths we will be recognising and ordering numbers to 20 and beyond; Place value; Finding one more and two more or one less and two less than a given number; Sort and describe 2D shapes and 3D solids; Continue a repeating pattern with three colours/shapes/objects; Symmetrical patterns; Know how key times of day are shown on the clock, analogue and digital; Begin to know months of the year, including important months, e.g. birthday, celebrated festivals; Recognise 1p, 2p, 5p and 10p coins and know the value of each. As part of our **Understanding of the World**, we will be finding out facts about the Arctic; Keeping hot/cold – hot water bottle experiment; discussing hibernation. We will also be making and finding dinosaur eggs, excavating for bones and fossils and carrying out a fizzing egg science experiment. During our **Physical Development** sessions, the children will be focusing on their agility, balance and coordination and creating dinosaur movements to turn into a class dance within our dance sessions. We are going to have lots of fun with Expressive Arts and Design, exploring textures by creating collages of Arctic animals, creating junk models and making cave paintings using natural mediums. In our **RE** we will be finding different ways that we can help others when they need it. Miss Garland and Mrs Duncan

Welcome back, I hope that you have all had a lovely Christmas and are looking forward to the term ahead. Our topic in Squirrel Class for the term is 'Around the world' and for this half term we will be focussing on China. In literacy we will be writing a traditional tale based on the story of 'Hansel and Gretel'. We will also be writing an information text about a dragon. Please have a look at http://www.roythezebra.com/ for some literacy games which you could play with your child at home. As mathematicians we will be looking at measuring, 3D shape, statistics, position and direction and solving missing number problems.

Please have a look at Jack Hartmann on YouTube for some fun songs to help your child learn their times tables. As scientists we will be looking at and classifying animals. In history we will be looking at the first aeroplane flight and learning about Orville and Wilbur Wright. In geography we will be looking at China and learning about where China is in the world. We will continue to have **PE** on a Wednesday and Friday, please could you ensure that your child has their PE kit in on these days and that they are named

Badger class topic is the **Mayan Civilisation.** This is a really interesting topic and I am sure the children will love it as much as they enjoyed the Romans, especially as the Mayans discovered Chocolate! We will be mapping the Mayans on a Map of America and looking at time lines. We will investigate the Mayan way of life and their writing and number system as well as finding out about significant buildings that still stand today. We will also find out how the Europeans discovered the Mayans and their reaction to them. As scientists we look at rocks and fossils as well as electricity. In Art and DT we will look at the artists Henri Matisse, Andy Warhol and Francis Bacon as well as design, make and evaluate Mayan masks and hot chocolate, Mayan Style! In Maths we will use the four operations to solve word problems and use fractions and decimals. We will also continue to master our times tables. In English the class will write a non-chronological report about the Mayan's way of life, re-write their own version of the Mayan creation story and write diary entries as the historical characters. Owls will be discovering the world of the Ancient Egypt through geography (atlas work) history (Rosetta Stone), computing (creating a fact file), DT (recipies and building pyramids), art (painting scenes and designing and making jewellry), PE (an obstacle course around a pyramid), science (materials and their properties) and preparing for stories and legends. In RE we are studying Christianity and Judaism. Our music is focused on improvisation. The children will continue to prepare for their end of year assessments, but we hope that the subjects planned will interest and engage. Mrs Smithson

Speed and accuracy for times tables recall and being able to apply their mathematical knowledge

to solve problems is essential in school and great life skills.

The impact of playing the games – which reinforce their phonics and key word recognition – is remarkable and these children are making superb progress. Please try to encourage your child to use the programme, alongside daily reading (even for those more confident readers and spellers).
