School transport

Parents can now apply for spare seats if your child is not eligible for Suffolk County Council (SCC) funded school travel.

Parents of children who are not eligible for SCC funded school travel, may wish to buy a spare seat for their child to travel to and from school on a vehicle that SCC has arranged specifically for children eligible for SCC funded school travel.

There is no guarantee that a spare seat will be or continue to be available as this will depend on the number of seats needed for children who are eligible for SCC funded school travel. School travel capacity is re-assessed every school term. This may mean that the offer of a spare seat could be withdrawn if more children become eligible for SCC funded school travel.

Free school meals update

The Department for Education (DfE) has recently updated its guidance on Free School Meals (FSM), with important changes coming into effect from September 2026. Please read the following carefully to understand how this may affect your child.

What's Staying the Same – until August 2026

If your child has been eligible for Free School Meals at any time between April 2018 and August 2026, they will continue to receive FSM. You do not need to reapply, even if your household income or circumstances have changed. Protections were introduced to support families and ensure children receive a free school meal regardless of any financial change in circumstances during the rollout of Universal Credit and this will remain in place until the end of the 2025/2026 school year.

What This Means for You

If your child is moving from primary to secondary school in September 2025, you do not need to reapply for FSM at that point.

What's Changing – From September 2026

From the 2026/2027 school year, all children in households receiving Universal Credit will be entitled to Free School Meals, regardless of income. The current £7,400 income threshold will be removed. Transitional protections will end. To qualify for FSM from September 2026 onward, your household must be receiving Universal Credit at the time of eligibility assessment. From September 2026, schools and local authorities will check FSM eligibility once a year, to avoid any sudden changes for families during the school year.

Supporting children and young people to manage their emotions

On Thursday 17th July, SENDIASS is hosting a relaxed online session for parents and carers exploring ways to help your child to understand and manage their feelings. This will run from 10am until 11:30am. They will also explore strategies which schools may use, and how they can access advice to enable them to support your child. The presentation will be delivered by specialist teachers from Suffolk's Social, Emotional and Mental Health Service. This is one of the five Specialist Education Services in Suffolk, which support schools to support pupils with different special educational needs. The session will explore: • what your child's behaviour may be communicating • strategies to support your child • what can lead to meltdowns and how to support your child during and after a meltdown • strategies schools may use and how they can access advice to help them support your child.
