<u>History</u>	Developments in the Bronze Age and Iron Age
<u>RE</u>	Christianity
<u>French</u>	Instruments, seasons and ice cream
<u>Art/DT</u>	Plant drawings.

Your child will be sent home with spellings from the Y3/4 National Curriculum. These will be printed out and given to your child. The spellings we will be focussing on each will be detailed on the printout. Your child will be tested on the highlighted spellings at the end of the week.

Reading

Please encourage your child to read daily. If they read to themselves, they are more than welcome to write in their reading records.

Maths
